Whereas, Like all hardworking Americans, federal employees

    deserve respect and fair treatment on the job. This means that they

    need adequate protections against the unlawful taking of their

    livelihood. Assuring that they cannot be fired without just cause

    not only benefits federal employees, but protects American citizens

         Whereas, President Donald Trump has continuously undermined

    the federal workforce since taking office in January. Specifically,
    many federal employees have been summarily discharged, without
9

    adequate notice, just cause, or being provided any performance-
    related reasoning for their termination. Further, on March 27,

    2025, President Trump issued an executive order outlawing

    collective bargaining for nearly a million federal workers, citing

    a little-used provision of federal labor law related to national

    security issues. Eliminating the right of federal employees to
    collectively bargain eliminates their voice and right to fair
16
    treatment in employment decisions; and

         Whereas, The Trump administration's actions undermine the

    principles of fair treatment and just cause for all workers. As the

    critical to our country and to communities across our state that
